This two-volume project identifies errors in Nietzsche's moral psychology that lead to his incoherent aristocratic elitism, develops his surprising similarities with Marx's historical materialism, and critically reconstructs a democratic-socialist politics from his critique of free will compatibilism, his rejection of moral means of human improvement, and his ideals of the "manifold soul" and the "love of fate," grounded in a heightened feeling of power in equal internal and external sources of resistance rather than in domination.
