Introduction

The research covers everything you need to know to be a subject matter expert in American terrorism, including why some crimes are called acts of terror and others are not, and learn how this designation affects sentencing and proof of intent.

By examining U.S. Citizens convicted of crimes related to terrorism, this study confirms previous findings, expands upon them, and develops an eight-marker profile that can be used to increase situational awareness and help steer individuals down a better path.

Additionally, the authors looked at more than fifty variables to share patterns in the data. Variables included in this study are: age at time of arrest/attack, age group, allegiance, Anwar al-Awaki, attended terrorist training camp (and location), birth location, charges, children, citizenship status, converted to Islam, detained abroad, education (school/major/stem), ethnicity, FBI involvement, gender, how law became aware, killed, killed abroad, marital status, mental illness (type), military (current military status, rank, officer/enlisted/civilian, MOS/job, discharge, convert while in military, time in service), name, occupation, offense, official charges, parents birth location, plot (partners), prison (security), recidivism, released (year), residence city/state, sentence, social class, status of case, target, use of violence, war, weapons, #wounded and year of indictment or attack.

We believe that such an understanding will help to halt the recruitment of American citizens by identifying the common traits of terrorists and the social circumstances that render a person susceptible to radicalization, priming them to commit acts of terrorism. By creating a well-sourced and researched list of behaviors, we offer methods for the curbing of radicalization.

Overview

This research identifies the attributes of an American terrorist by studying the patterns within 50 demographic variables and exploring their correlation with the motivation to commit crimes related to terrorism. We believe that such an understanding will help to halt the recruitment of American citizens by instructing concerned parents, coaches, teachers, and family members how to quickly identify a person that is susceptible to radicalization and how to intervene.

Studies conducted 20 years ago have identified some markers by examining international terrorists: single, male, early 20's, university education, and from an affluent middle or upper-class family (Russell, 1977; Jenkins, 1980, Dingley, 1997). This study confirms the previous findings and expands upon them by examining U.S. citizens convicted of crimes related to terrorism.

Additional characteristics scrutinized include the location of residence, crime and imprisonment, religion, organizational alliances, race, heritage and path to citizenship, field of study and occupation, social status, military experience, mental health, marriage and family, conviction, punishment, and target.

We endeavor to continue identifying the common traits of terrorists and the social circumstances that render a person susceptible to radicalization and prime them to commit acts of terrorism. By creating a well-sourced and researched list of behaviors we offer methods for community-based curbing of radicalization.

Definitions of Terrorism



Domestic Terrorism

"...the unlawful use of force and violence against persons or property to intimidate or coerce a government, the civilian population, or any segment thereof, in furtherance of political or social objectives"



International Terrorism

"...activities that involve violent acts or acts dangerous to human life that is a violation of the criminal law..., appear to be intended to intimidate or coerce a civilian population, influence the policy of a government, or to affect the conduct of a government by mass destruction, assassination, or kidnapping"



Terrorism

"The unlawful use of violence or threat of violence, often motivated by religious, political, or other ideological beliefs, to instill fear and coerce governments or societies in pursuit of goals that are usually political"

What Makes a Crime an Act of Terror?



If an individual pulls out a gun and fires at school kids or co-workers, the individual is not likely to be prosecuted as a terrorist.

US Code Title 18— Crimes & Criminal Procedure

18 U.S.C. § 2339B, which punishes knowingly providing material support or resources to a designated foreign terrorist organization ("DFTO") or attempting or conspiring to do so.


In June 2015, Congress increased the penalty for violations of these offenses to a maximum of 20 years from the previous maximum of 15 years.

The guideline for material support offenses, USSG § 2M5.3, carries a base offense level of 26.

If the offense involved dangerous weapons, firearms, explosives, funds to purchase any of those items, or funds or other support believing they will be used to commit a violent act, 2 levels are added.

Terrorism Enhancement Charge

§3A1.4. Terrorism

- (a) If the offense is a felony that involved, or was intended to promote, a federal crime of terrorism, increase by 12 levels; but if the resulting offense level is less than level 32, increase to level 32.
- (b) In each such case, the defendant's criminal history category from Chapter Four (Criminal History and Criminal Livelihood) shall be Category VI.



Terrorism Legislation: INTENT



As recent as 1983 the FBI would not investigate a terrorist act unless it had more than one person involved.

Thirty pieces of legislation related to terrorism were enacted in the United States in 2015-2016.

Domestic or International Terrorist?

Meet BORIS (A). BORIS hates the United States so much he left his country and traveled to the United States to plan and train to commit an act of terror in the country.

Meet FRED (B). FRED is a US citizen, but hates his country so much he moved overseas and is now planning an act of terrorism on the United States while oversears.

Last Man Standing The 8-marker profile (stems from patterns identified in this research and the research of others) of a terrorist is presented as a game. This is to get people relaxed and encourage interactive communication.

The last man standing has an increased chance of becoming radicalized. Participants have many opportunities to "sit" if they do not want to be the last person standing. To begin everyone must stand.














Terrorism Residence Prior to Arrest






Terrorism Residence Prior to Arrest-Top 10 Cities








Domestic Terrorism Organizations (Active)

The U.S. government does not formally designate domestic terrorist organizations. Claiming an affiliation to a domestic terror organization is not illegal. Therefore, it may not be illegal to give money or other forms of material support to a domestic terrorist group, even if the group is known for its violence and hatred of others. The First Amendment protects the right of people to associate with each other and to express their points of view.

The United States only maintains a list of foreign terrorist organizations. We do not have a domestic counterpart. There's no legal framework for designating a domestic group as a terrorist group.






Black Lives Matter

Black Lives Matter is a leaderless organization started in 2013 to highlight racism, descrimination experienced by people of color.


On June 6, half a million people turned out to march in support of BLM in nearly 550 places across the United States.



Terror Timeline




Researchers use timelines like this one to predict what the future may hold. There are several peaks in this timeline. The first one is around 2003, what could this rise in terrorism be stemming from?






MILITARY TERRORISTS USE OF VIOLENCE







Hate Symbology: Hand Signs

White supremacists, primarily on the West Coast, may use a twohanded hand sign consisting of one hand showing or flashing two fingers and the other hand showing or flashing three fingers.

The number 88 is a symbolically important number for white supremacists (who use it as a numeric code for "Heil Hitler"), so occasionally a white supremacist will use a hand sign to display or flash the number 88.

The Aryan Brotherhood of Texas, a prison gang, uses a hand symbol consisting of a raised index finger and raised ring and little fingers, signifying the numbers 1 and 2.

The Aryan Circle is one of the largest white supremacist prison gangs in the US.

The largest white supremacist prison gang in Tennessee is Aryan Nations (a different group than the neo-Nazi group of the same name).

The European Kindred is a white supremacist prison gang based primarily in Oregon. The hand sign of the Hammerskins, a racist skinhead group, consists of two crossed forearms emulating the "crossed hammers" of the Hammerskins logo.

The Nazi salute debuted in Nazi Germany in the 1930s as a way to pay homage to Adolf Hitler. It consists of raising an outstretched right arm with the palm down.

Some Ku Klux Klan members use a hand sign that consists of angling the index and middle fingers out to the side in order to look vaguely like the letter "K."

A common hand gesture used by many on the for the purpose of trolling liberals, the symbol eventually came to be used by actual white supremacists as well. Caution must be used in evaluating instances of this symbol's use.

The term "peckerwood" originated as a racial epithet directed at whites. It has been adopted by the white supremacist prison gang subculture, especially in southern and western states, to refer to itself.

Peckerwood Midwest is a white supremacist gang based primarily in Missouri, active both in prisons and on the streets. The Solid Wood Soldiers are a Texasbased white supremacist prison gang. The tattoo consists of the initials SWS, with the two S's represented by lightning bolts. Above the initials appears the image of a bear claw, with the number 4 in the middle and sometimes the letters HCRL.


In the 2000s, white supremacists created a handsign intended to memorialize the Schutzstaffeln or SS of Nazi Germany, Hitler's secret police, political army, and concentration camp guards.

The Supreme White Alliance was a hardcore racist skinhead gang based primarily in the Midwest.

The hand sign used by the Vinlanders Social Club, a racist skinhead gang, consists of holding up the first, second, and fourth fingers of one hand.

Members of the white supremacist group Volksfront used several handsigns to represent their gang. A common one-handed sign features the fingers of the right hand divided into a "V" shape, often held over the chest.

Some white supremacists, particularly in California, may use a two-handed handsign in which one hand forms the letter "W" and the other hand forms the letter "P," to represent WP or "White Power."

Atomwaffen Division is a neo-Nazi group that emerged in 2016. "Atomwaffen" is the German word for atomic weapons. Blood & Hongur, an international neo-Nazi/racist skinhead group started by British white supremacist and singer lan Stuart. The primary insignia of Ku Klux Klan groups is the MIOAK (or "Mystic Insignia of a Klansman"), commonly referred to as the "blood drop" cross.

Blue-eyed devil is a racial epithet directed at people of European ancestry that originated in Asia. Bound for Glory is the name of a white power music band (dating back to 1989) from Minneapolis.

The European Kindred is a large white supremacist prison gang based primarily in Oregon. Firm 22 is the name used by the Vinlanders Social Club and refers to supporters of the group who are not actually members.

Free America Rally is a network of white supremacists who hold protests and rallies on white supremacist-related themes.


